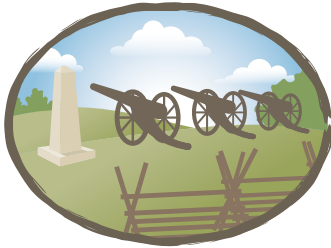

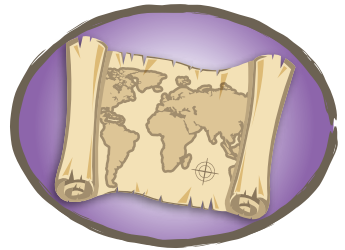

Thank you for joining us for the 11th year of **Get Outdoors (GO) Lebanon!** This summer program, brought to you each year by **WellSpan Health** and **Lebanon County Library System**, encourages children and their families to get outdoors and get moving as they explore Lebanon County. This year's theme — **GO and Discover the Past!** — will

give you fun ways to learn about tools used to dig up ancient treasures, industries that shaped our journey through history, and even a few dinosaurs! Fifteen "site markers" — wooden posts with an etching plate attached — have been hidden in local and state parks and sites around Lebanon County. This **Ledger** contains clues to follow as you hike to find the post at each location. See the next page to find out how to get started on your summer adventures as you **Discover the Past!**



You can also **Unearth a Story** at your local library this summer, where you'll find books to read about each site marker. You'll improve your reading and learning skills while you earn virtual badges from the library for recording your reading minutes and activities in the **Beanstack** app. Each badge earns you a reward — log three hikes to earn the **GO and Discover the Past!** badge and participation prize. Hike Difficulty Ratings



EASY - A short distance hike on fairly level ground.



MODERATE - A longer distance walk on fairly level ground, or a short distance with some hills.



HARD - A long distance walk with hills and some obstacles.

Note: Distances to all site markers were measured using a standard smart phone app. The total distances listed for each hike are roundtrip, unless specified otherwise.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

1. Choose a Site Marker!

Look through your **Ledger** (program guide) and choose the site marker you want to find.



2. Find your Route!

Follow the driving directions on pages 18 & 19 that will take you to the parking area for your site marker's hike.



3. Ready, Set, Hike!

Follow the clues on the site marker page to find the starting point and where you can find the post.



4. Remember the Code!

At the post, use a crayon or pencil to fill in the space on your rubbing sheet. Don't forget to copy the 4-digit code – you'll need it later!



5. Back to the Start!

Each hike includes directions to get back to your vehicle. Take any trash with you to keep things neat and tidy!



6. Go Online!

Use the **Beanstack** app (computer or phone) to enter your code. You can also log any reading minutes there!



7. Repeat as Needed!

Keep hiking and entering site marker codes in **Beanstack**. You can enter drawings for great prizes while you stay active this summer!

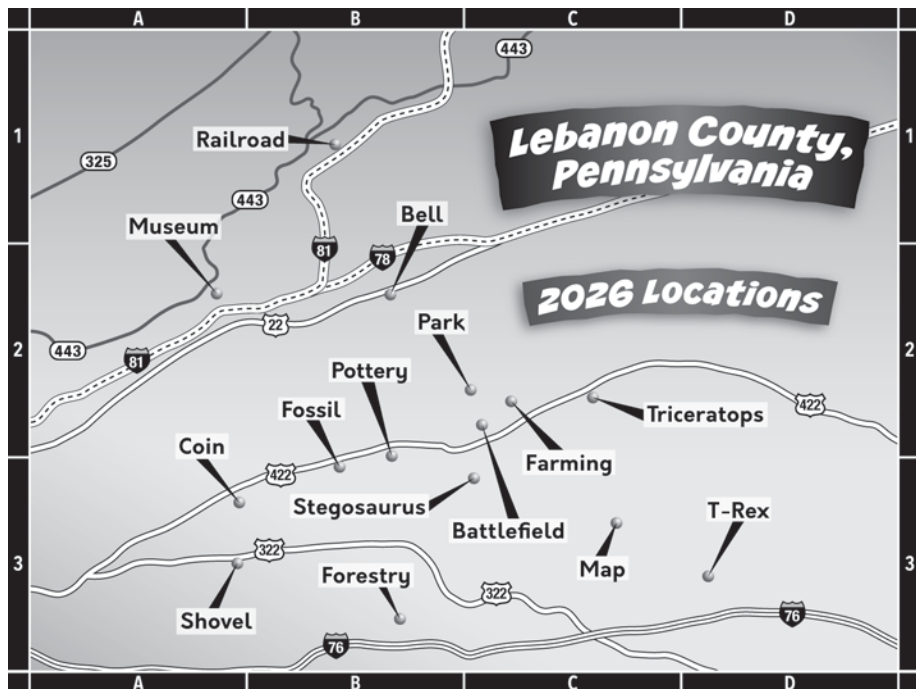

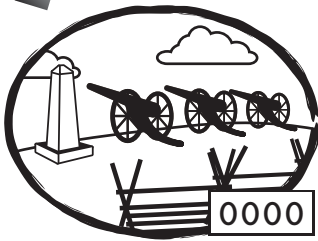

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area off of North 5th Avenue and East Canal Street.
2. Facing the baseball fields, begin walking to the right in the grass around the outfield fence of the baseball field closest to you/the parking area.
3. Continue walking straight ahead, past the tennis courts, and then turn left immediately after the tennis courts to walk between the fence and the evergreen tree line.
4. Continue walking straight ahead, going past another baseball field on your left.
5. Turn left, and walk between a set of bleachers and a scoreboard, toward a grove of trees.
6. Follow the tree line as it curves right, passing the playground on your left and another baseball field on your right.
7. Continue walking past a yellow and brown pole and a group of 4 trees on your left, turning left after this group of trees, and walk toward the next yellow and brown pole you can see.
8. Ahead, you should see a pond, and the post will be nearby.
9. To return to your vehicle, keep walking in the direction you were going before finding the post, passing the pond on your right, and then turning left at the next yellow and brown pole.
10. Continue walking straight ahead toward the playground, finally turning right to pick up the paved path toward the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Turn into the parking area off of North Mill Street and park in the center of the roundabout.
2. Pick up the paved path near the handicap parking, turning left to follow the tree line.
3. Follow the path as it curves to the left, then through the intersection, using the crosswalk.
4. Continue following the path as it loops around.
5. As you approach a set of black bike racks and a white sign/map on your left, turn right.
6. Continue past the red gate, and follow the path left at the fork.
7. Shortly after the path curves right, you will pass some soccer fields and baseball fields, and the post will be on your left between two benches.
8. To return to your vehicle, continue following the path in the direction you were headed, following along as it curves to the right two more times.
9. As you approach the red gate again, turn left and you should see the parking area ahead.

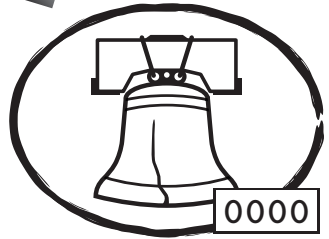

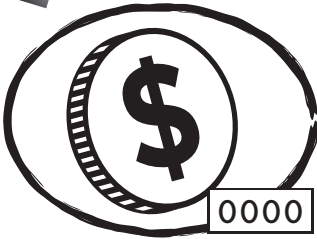

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area off of East Birch Street and South Duke Street.
2. Pick up the paved path and walk toward the playground (away from the baseball field).
3. Follow the path as it goes around the playground, passing another parking area on your right.
4. Once the paved path ends, continue your hike on the grass between the trees.
5. Continue walking along the tree line, turning left at the end of the field, passing a green bench on your right.
6. Turn left again once you approach another green bench, and the post will be on a tree to your right.
7. To return to your vehicle, continue walking in the direction you were headed, between the rows of trees, around the back of the baseball field, and back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Pull into the parking area off of Narrows Drive and park near the playground to the left of the parking area.
2. Start the hike on the paved path, beginning at the green "PAVED WALKING TRAIL" sign.
3. Continue walking straight ahead, passing between the playground and green pavilion (pavilion #1).
4. At the first intersection you find, continue walking straight ahead and follow the path as it curves right.
5. At the next intersection, turn left and follow the path as it winds about, turning left at the next intersection you come to.
6. Immediately after passing disc golf basket #15, turn left and head into the woods; you will pass disc golf basket #10 on your right.
7. Follow the trail to the left, and you will find the post ahead on your right. (If you pass disc golf basket #7, you have gone too far.)
8. To return to your vehicle, turn around and retrace your steps uphill to the paved path.
9. Once you reach the paved path, turn left and follow it straight ahead and as it curves right.
10. At the next intersection you come to, continue straight, and then immediately turn left at the following intersection to follow the path back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the “Trailhead for Governor Dick” roadside parking area off of Pinch Road.
2. Locate the large “GOVERNOR DICK” rock and wooden park sign and pick up the trail that begins immediately to the left of the sign.
3. Follow the trail ahead, walking past the yellow gate on your right.
4. When you reach a Y intersection, turn right toward trail 3.
5. When you reach the next intersection, continue straight, following the yellow blazes and a sign for trail 3.
6. At the following intersection, turn left to continue the trail uphill, passing the first trail on your left, and turning left at the next sign for trail marker 2 (you will pass a bench on your left and a sign for “Narrow Gauge Railroad” on your right).
7. Continue following the red blazes straight ahead, and the post will be just after a set of tree stumps on either side of the trail.
8. To return to your vehicle, continue following the trail ahead.
9. When you reach the next intersection, turn left at the red pole; you should see red circle blazes on the trees and a sign for trail 7 ahead.
10. Carefully continue following the trail downhill for a while.
11. Shortly after passing a brown pole on your left and a red pole on your right, you will pass a sign for trail 5 on your right; continue straight ahead and you will see the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. After turning onto Bachman Road, go past the first parking area on your left, and park in the second parking area near the wooden bridge.
2. Locate the trail between the “Quittie Creek Nature Park” sign and wooden bridge.
3. Follow the trail for a while as it winds about along the creek.
4. When you reach the road (Spruce Street), carefully cross it (using the crosswalk), and continue following the trail ahead.
5. Follow the trail through the open field and back into the woods along the creek, and the post will be nearby (on your left), shortly after passing a bench on your right.
6. To return to your vehicle, turn around and retrace your steps through the woods along the creek, crossing the open field, carefully crossing the street, and again walking through the woods along the creek, back to the parking area near the bridge.

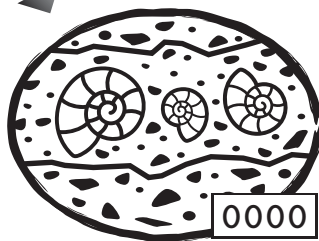

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area off of Mill Road.
2. Stand in the grass with your back to the parking area, and turn right to follow the grass perimeter, passing the township building with white garage doors on your right.
3. Shortly after passing a small, old gas station on your right, follow the grass perimeter as it curves left.
4. Continue walking in the grass, alongside the gravel road, and you should pass a farm on your right.
5. Follow the grass perimeter as it curves left again, passing a set of signs on your right.
6. As you continue to walk in the grass alongside the gravel road, you will pass a baseball field and set of bleachers on your left; from there, the post will be straight ahead.
7. To return to your vehicle, keep walking in the direction you were headed, passing the post on your right, and immediately turning left to walk in between (or alongside if needed) the basketball court fence and tree line.
8. Keep walking straight ahead, following the tree line on your right, walking between the tree line and bleachers.
9. Continue following the tree line as it curves left and follows the outline of the baseball field; be sure to stay to the left of the trees to keep away from the road.
10. After passing another set of bleachers on your left, continue walking between the rows of trees straight ahead, passing the playground on your left and the bathrooms on your right, and you will see the parking area ahead.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area for Middle Road, off of Boundary Road, near the bathrooms and volleyball court.
2. Locate Lakeside Trail and follow it straight ahead along the gravel path, passing the lake on your right.
3. When you reach a fork in the trail, turn left and follow the sign for Grassland Trail.
4. At the next fork, continue following the trail to the left, passing the parking area on your right.
5. Keep following the trail ahead, along the parking area, passing the Upper Pavilion rest area on your left.
6. As you follow the trail into the woods, you will cross a bridge.
7. Continue following the trail as it curves left, and the post will be on your left.
8. To return to your vehicle, continue following the trail in the direction you were headed, following the gravel path to the right, then straight through the intersection and grasslands, back to the parking area.

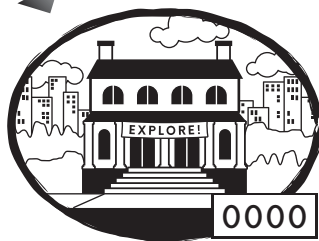

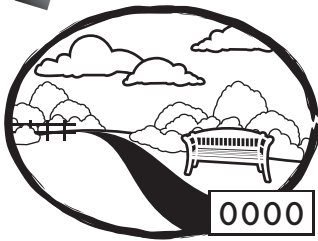

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the gravel parking area off of North 8th Avenue.
2. Start on the paved path in front of you (between the large rocks and soccer field), immediately turning left after you step on the path.
3. Continue straight into the grass at the first T intersection, walking along the outfield fence of a baseball field.
4. At the end of the fence, turn right, and walk in between the tree line and baseball field.
5. Continue up a steep hill and head toward the baseball field directly in front of you.
6. Once you pass the pavilion on your right, turn right, and head toward the paved path, following it until you reach another parking area.
7. Turn right to follow the path down a steep hill, and the post will be on your left within a grove of trees.
8. To return to your vehicle, get back on the paved path, and continue down the hill, following the path as it heads right at a bench; you will see the parking area ahead.
9. After your hike, for some extra fun, be sure to check out the playground, athletic courts, and other cool spaces further up the hill (off of North 7th Street/Kimmerlings Road).

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area off of South Garfield Street near the playground.
2. Standing in the parking area, face the “Cleona Community Park” sign/playground and begin by turning left to follow the grass along the parking area. You will pass a bench on your right and a large shed on your left.
3. After you pass the large shed, turn right and walk through the grass past the baseball field ahead/on your right.
4. Once you reach a small gravel area, turn right and continue walking around the baseball field (the tree line and creek should be on your left).
5. Continue walking ahead, along the creek and behind a second baseball field.
6. You should soon see a gravel trail on your left; continue your hike following this trail as it winds about along the creek.
7. As the trail moves away from the creek, you should see the post nearby; it will be along a tree line to the left of the trail.
8. To return to your vehicle, continue along the gravel trail uphill, picking up the paved path it connects with, and passing some tennis courts and a basketball court on your left.
9. Continue walking along the paved path through the mini golf area and playground.
10. As you approach the brick pavilion, follow the path to the right and it will lead you back to the parking area.

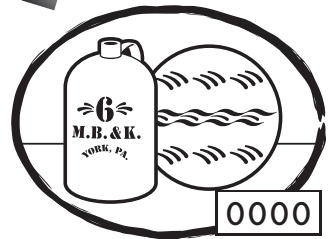

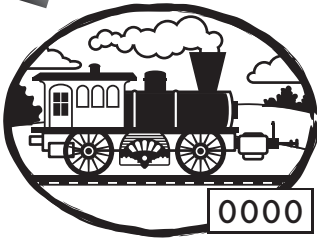

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the large parking area off of/at the end of Sand Siding Road.
2. With your back to the parking area, follow the gravel trail (Swatara Rail Trail) to the right.
3. Continue following the trail straight ahead for a while, enjoying the beautiful scenery and nature as you go.
4. After walking a little over 1.5 miles, the post will be on your right in a small clearing.
5. To return to your vehicle, turn around and retrace your steps along the trail back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the main parking area off of Lawn Road and Lyndel Drive.
2. With your back to the playground, find the path that starts on your left just past the gravel parking area.
3. Follow the path along the gravel parking area and turn left at the first intersection you come to.
4. Keep following the path around the soccer fields, continuing straight ahead past the next intersection you find (you will pass the pavilion and playground on your left).
5. The post will be on one of the last trees on your left before you come to a bend in the path.
6. To return to your vehicle, continue along in the direction you were going before finding the post, passing a bridge on your right, walking around more soccer fields, and following the path as it leads back to the parking area.

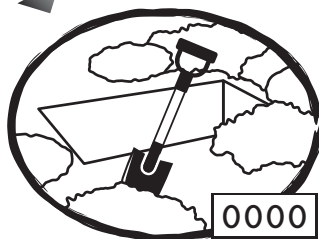

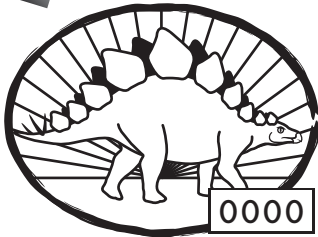

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the large parking area off of South Lincoln Avenue.
2. Begin on the path near the bathrooms.
3. At the first intersection you come to, turn right and follow the path between the basketball courts and pavilion (South Pavilion).
4. Continue past the playground on your left and sandbox on your right.
5. At the next two intersections, veer right along the path (toward the baseball fields).
6. Continue following the path uphill, veering right at the first fork, and then continuing straight at the next intersection; you should pass disc golf platform/basket 15 on your left.
7. After passing disc golf platform 2 on your right, the post will be up ahead on your left.
8. To return to your vehicle, continue along the path in the direction you were headed as it goes uphill.
9. After passing a parking area on your right, continue following the path to the left and then straight through the crosswalk, passing the playground and pickleball courts on your left.
10. Continue along the path as it curves left and then passes between the East Pavilions (on your left) and basketball courts (on your right).
11. At the next two forks you come to, veer right and continue following the path past the sandbox (on your left) and playground (on your right), passing between the South Pavilion and basketball courts, to follow the path all the way back to the bathrooms and parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area for Valley View Trail off of T987/Laurel Drive.
2. Find the trail going uphill with white blazes; the trail should be straight ahead when facing away from the road.
3. Continue to follow the trail as it winds uphill, following signs for Valley View Trail and the white blazes.
4. At a double white-blazed tree, take a sharp right to continue the trail uphill, and follow more white blazes as they zigzag sharply up the hill.
5. At the top of the hill, follow the trail to the right, looking for the white blazes ahead.
6. You will pass a double bench area on your right, overlooking the valley below. Continue along the trail uphill to find the post.
7. To return to your vehicle, continue following the trail ahead, following more white blazes.
8. When you reach trail signs for Horse-Shoe Trail and Valley View Trail, turn right and follow the white blazes for Valley View Trail.
9. Continue downhill on the trail as it zigzags as it goes.
10. Closer to the bottom of the hill, you'll pass a double white-blazed tree on your right and come to a large, uprooted tree. Pass this tree on your left, and continue following the white blazes ahead.
11. As you approach the road, look for a blue blaze to your right and turn toward it (at this point, you will be exiting the Valley View Trail and turning onto the Explorer Trail; if you reach the road, you have gone too far).
12. Continue parallel to the road, following blue blazes until you reach a set of trail signs.
13. When you reach trail signs for Valley View Trail and Explorer Trail, turn left and go downhill (following the white blazes) to the parking area ahead.

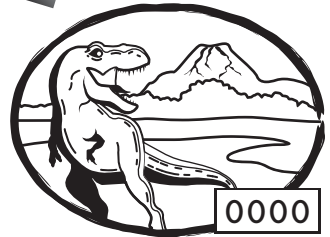

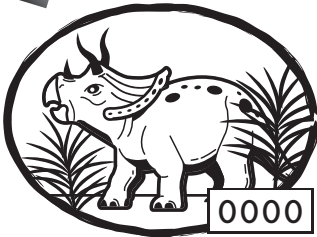

CLUES for your hike!

1. Pull into the parking area off of South Fairlane Avenue, marked with a white “Jackson Recreational Park” sign on a guardrail, and drive to the end of the parking area.
2. With the creek to your right, face a disc golf basket at the end of the parking area, and you should see a path on your left going uphill through two yellow posts (a tan pavilion will also be on your left); start walking along this path.
3. Follow the path as it curves to the left and through another parking area, passing a tan building on your right.
4. Follow the path as it curves left.
5. Continue following the path straight ahead, as it curves left, and then downhill.
6. Just before you reach another set of yellow posts, turn left.
7. Follow the path as it goes back uphill to your left.
8. After passing two tan buildings on your left, the path will end; from there, turn right, and walk through the grass, passing the tan pavilion on your right.
9. When you see the path ahead, turn right, follow it through the yellow posts, and carefully cross the creek straight ahead.
10. Once you reach grass, walk across the open field, cross over the paved path, and you should see the post.
11. To return to your vehicle, turn around and retrace your steps, crossing the paved path, open field, and creek, back to the parking area.

Campbelltown Community Park (Shovel)

Hours: Dawn to dusk, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, and then use the left lane to turn right on Cumberland St. Turn left on S 10th St, continue on Quentin Rd, and turn right on PA-241 S/Colebrook Rd. At the traffic circle, continue straight on PA-241, turn right on US-322 W/Horseshoe Pike, and turn left on Lawn Rd. Turn right on Lyndel Dr, and the parking area will be ahead on your left. Park near the playground.

Clarence Schock Memorial Park – Governor Dick Trailhead (Forestry)

Hours: Sunrise to sunset, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, and then use any lane to turn right on Cumberland St. Turn left on S 12th St, continue straight to stay on S 12th St, and turn right on PA-241 S/Colebrook Rd. At the traffic circle, continue straight on PA-241, continue on Butler Rd, and turn right on PA-117 N. Turn left on Pinch Rd, and the roadside parking area will be on your left.

Cleona Community Park/Playground (Pottery)

Hours: Dawn to dusk, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, and then use any lane to turn right on Cumberland St. Continue on E Penn Ave, turn left on S Garfield St, and the parking area will be on your right. Park near the playground.

Heidelberg Township Park/Playground (Map)

Hours: Dawn to dusk, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, and then use the left lane to turn right on Cumberland St. Turn left on S 7th St, turn left on Walnut St, and turn right on PA-897 S/S 5th Ave. Continue to follow PA-897 S, turn right on Mill Rd, and turn left into the parking area.

Jackson Recreational Park (Triceratops)

Hours: 7am-9pm, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning left on N 7th St, turn right on Lehman St, and turn right on N 11th Ave. Turn left on E Old Cumberland St and right on King St. Turn left on S Fairlane Ave, and then turn left into the parking area with the white “Jackson Recreational Park” sign on the guardrail. Park in the far end of the parking area.

Lenni Lenape Park (Farming)

Hours: 6am-8pm, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning left on N 7th St, turn right on Maple St, and turn right on Weavertown Rd. Turn left on Narrows Dr, and then turn left at the “Lenni Lenape Park Entrance” sign. Park near the playground to the left of the parking area.

Louser Memorial Park Northeast (Battlefield)

Hours: 7am-9pm, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning left on N 7th St, turn right on Lehman St, and turn left on N 5th Ave. Continue straight ahead, and the parking area will be at the end of the road.

Memorial Lake State Park – Middle Road (Museum)

Hours: Sunrise to sunset, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, and then turn right at the first cross street on Willow St. Turn right on N 9th St, turn left on PA-72 N/Maple St, and continue to follow PA-72 N. Soon after crossing over PA-22, turn left on Awol Rd. Continue on Biddle Rd/Biddle Dr, then turn left on Fisher Ave. Turn right on Asher Miner Rd, turn left on Boundary Rd, and then turn left on Middle Rd for the parking area. Park near the bathrooms and volleyball court.

Middle Creek Wildlife Management Area – Valley View Trail (T-Rex)

Hours: Dawn to dusk, unless posted
Visitors Center: 8am–4pm, Tue–Sun

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, use the left lane to turn right on Cumberland St, and turn left on S 7th St. Turn left on Walnut St, turn right on PA-897 S/S 5th Ave, continue to follow PA-897 S/E Main St, and turn right on Hopeland Rd. Continue on Kleinfeltersville Rd, turn right on Laurel Dr/T987, and the parking area will be on your left.

North Lebanon Township Community Park – North Lebanon Baseball Field (Park)

Hours: Dawn to dusk, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning left on N 7th St and travel for about 2.1 miles. Turn right on N 8th Ave, and the parking area will be ahead on your right.

North Mill Street Park (Bell)

Hours: 7am–8pm, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning left on N 7th St, continue to follow N 7th St, and then continue on PA-343 N/S Pine Grove St. Turn left on US-22 W, turn left on N Mill St, and turn left into the parking area.

Quittie Creek Nature Park (Fossil)

Hours: Sunrise to sunset, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, use any lane to turn right on Cumberland St, and continue on E Penn Ave. Continue on E Main St, turn left on Bachman Rd, and park in the second parking area near the wooden bridge.

Southeast Family Park (Coin)

Hours: Sunrise to sunset, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, use any lane to turn right on Cumberland St, and continue on E Penn Ave. Continue on US-422 W/E Main St into Palmyra. Turn left on S Duke St, turn left on E Birch St, and the parking area will be ahead.

South Hills Park (Stegosaurus)

Hours: Dawn to dusk, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, use the left lane to turn right on Cumberland St, and turn left on S 7th St. Turn left on Walnut St, turn right on S Lincoln Ave, and then turn left into the parking area.

Swatara State Park – Sand Siding Trailhead (Railroad)

Hours: Sunrise to sunset, unless posted

Directions to Parking Area: Start by turning right on N 7th St, turn right at the first cross street on Willow St, and turn right on N 9th St. Turn left on PA-72 N/Maple St and continue to follow PA-72 N for about 12.6 miles. Continue straight on PA-443 E for 3.1 miles, then turn right on Sand Siding Rd/T650. The parking area will be ahead on your right.

REWARDS & PRIZES

All **GO Lebanon!** children who find a minimum of three different site markers from June 1 to August 15 will receive a reward for participating in the program.

More Parks = More Chances to Win

For every site marker you identify and log into **Beanstack**, you earn one point. Each park post you log increases your chances of winning one of five prizes, as follows:

4-9 different site markers identified = 1 chance to win a prize

10-14 different site markers identified = 2 chances to win a prize

All 15 site markers identified = 3 chances to win a prize

Even though five prizes will be awarded, remember that all **GO Lebanon!** children who find and submit at least three different site markers will receive a reward!

The last day to locate “site markers” is **Saturday, August 15**. All hikes must be logged no later than **Saturday, August 22** to receive the participation reward and earn entries into the prize drawing. If you need help logging hikes, please call or visit your local library and ask staff for assistance. The **Ledger** (program guide) and rubbing sheet you used to find each site marker are yours to keep and do not need to be returned.

STAY SAFE OUTDOORS

When you're outdoors, you could run into bugs, animals, poisonous plants, and other risks and dangers. Keep these **safety tips** in mind on your adventures:

- Know the parks and places you're going to visit *before* you get there.
- Follow any park rules and respect the environment. Take trash home.
- Never hike alone, and let others know where you're going.
- Keep your valuables safe — lock them in your vehicle or take them with you.
- Protect yourself from the sun — wear a hat and use sunscreen.
- Stay hydrated — bring water along and drink even if you aren't thirsty.
- Stay alert for the weather and seek safe shelter if it gets dangerous.
- Watch your step — logs, branches, roots, and rocks can trip you up!
- Poison ivy, oak, or sumac might be near a trail or post — be careful!
- Look out for wild things — spiders, snakes, bugs, and other critters.
- Keep annoying bugs away — use bug repellent spray or other products.
- Use caution around all bodies of water — ponds, rivers, and streams.
